Traditions of Beekeeping in Gozo

A n t h r o p o l o g i c a l W o r k s h o p

The aim of this workshop is to do collective research on beekeeping traditions in Gozo and Malta in an interdisciplinary setting.

General Workshop Structure

The program starts with a field introduction by local experts. Based on that experience, and the level of the individual participant, a research topic will be further refined. Each participant will conduct his/her own research, in collaboration with the Expeditions/ University of Leuven team and the other participants. As we are aiming for an interdisciplinary approach, students and researchers from a variety of disciplines are very welcome to apply

(sociologists, biologists, nutritionists, historians, architects...).

The objective of the workshop is to finalize a publishable journal volume containing articles from each participant. The workshop itself is focussed on data collection and primary analyses. Writing and editing of the article or results will be done afterwards through online collaboration.

Goals

- Collect data on current and past practices of beekeeping in Malta and Gozo.
- Explore the potential of interdisciplinary methods in this particular field.

- Publish anthropological work on beekeeping traditions in Gozo.

Certification

Transcript of records will be provided, though the main credit will come from the publication of the article.

Eligible candidates

- Open to all students and researchers in Anthropology and other sciences.
- Reserved spots for students enlisted in the Off the Beaten Track program (see website).
- Candidates are selected based on a written motivation.
- Maximum of 8 participants

Program Cost
